

3. ENTRY

• Entry for the Elite class

Competitors in elite classes must be registered through their federation. Each federation may enter up to 10 competitors each class - up to 5 women and 5 men. The federation should provide the list of their elite class runners.

encourage this have offered 20% discount of full entry fee. To take advantage of the early payment, organizers must receive payment before August 1, 2012. After August 1 2012, the participants must pay the full entry fee.

Note 3: Participation in the team official meeting demand status of either a team official or a competitor. The team official who will participate to the competition shall also register as competitors.

• E-card

Timing and Punching system will be Learnjoy Timing System which has been successfully used in IOF WREs and China Orienteering Championships for many years. The deposit for E-card is 100 RMB for all competitions. When participants return the E-card at the finish of the final race, the deposit will be paid back.

Introduction of Wuxi

Wuxi (无锡) is a city on the Yangtse River between Suzhou and Nanjing, which is located in the south of Jiangsu Province, half way between the cities of Shanghai and Nanjing, with Shanghai 128km to its east and Nanjing 183km to its west. Because of its recent development, Wuxi has been dubbed the "little Shanghai".

Wuxi is moist and temperate, belonging to that of the sub-tropical maritime with distinct seasons. The average annual temperature is 15.5° C, though it seldom sees snow. Wuxi is a famous cultural city with a history of over 3,000 years. The establishment of the city can be traced back to the end of the Shang Dynasty. The place used to be rich in tin deposit during the Zhou and Qin dynasties. As the tin was depleted by the end of the Qin Dynasty, the place was called Wuxi, meaning "a place without tin".




LINGSHAN BUDDHIST SCENIC AREA: Situated just south of Longshan Mountain 25k outside the vibrantly cultural city of Wuxi, the Lingshan Buddhist Scenic Area is dedicated to embracing the spiritual beauty of Buddhism. Lingshan serves as a symbol of Wuxi City with its significance as a Buddhist attraction recognized both throughout China and abroad. Nearly 2 million foreign visitors experience the stunning magnificence of Lingshan annually.



Taihu Lake, the scenic area. Within the northwestern shore of Taihu Lake in Wuxi Yuantouzhu is a peninsula, broke into the lake due to stone, shaped like a floating sea turtle named eagerly.Yuantouzhu Scenic Area was established in 1918, is an area of 500 hectares. There are mountains hidden charge show, deer top Ying Hui, turtle Che Chun-tao, Wang Yun Hill, Guangfu temple, Taihu Xiandao, Jiangnan Lan Yuan, the Sino-Japanese Friendship Forest cherry and many other attractions, colorful, each with style, is well-known foreign travel, vacation, health resorts.



Lihu new mountain west from calf dam, east Lihu Bridge, with a total area 135 square meters, since 2002, Wuxi Taihu Lake along the scenic city conducted a comprehensive renovation, after back fishing lakes, ecological dredging, a series of green building demolition projects, where the water from the 6.4 square kilometers to expand to 8.6 square kilometers, the water quality improved significantly. It have been largest open park in Wuxi.
